

CGTBB Regular Meeting August 9, 2011

President Terry Motsenbocker called the meeting to order at 7:35 p.m..

Treasurer (John Simon):

- Beginning balance (July 1, 2011) \$22,613.14
- Ending balance (July 31, 2011) \$42,507.03
- We have replenished our gift card inventory and see John if you need to buy any.
- The marching band uniform fund balance is : \$20,016.03
- Monthly statements include charges the students make when they receive accessories/equipment from the band office (i.e. valve oil).

Band Director (Kevin Schuessler):

- DCI is Friday. Mr. Schuessler has the tickets. The buses will leave at 4:30 and be back around 11:15.
- The drum corps are the next level. There are 10 graduates of CG in 5 different drum corps.
- Jeff Fer stated that there are 15 seats left on the 3 buses going to Philly/New York. \$550.00 will get you caught up if someone wants to go.
- New Parents: the month of September is the hardest month and the most developmental in respect to the marching show.
- There will be only 1 guard contest in the spring hosted by CGHS. Help is needed by all.
- The concert bands will see class a little differently this year. The students will be put in small groups to invest in the individual. The idea is to work on the individual getting better and that way the whole band gets better. Will use Smart Music.
- In marching band, we lost a marcher, but we gained one the same day!
- Mr. Schuessler introduces Mr. Rich Arkanoff, CG Superintendent.

Mr. Rich Arkanoff (Superintendent, Center Grove Schools)

- Mr. Ray Skillman's donation to Center Grove Athletics and Fine Arts. Mr. Skillman called board member, Carol Tumey and they talked about his donation and athletics and then they discussed other groups who would benefit from a donation.
- Community Health Network's donation to Center Grove Schools. Considered Capitol Projects Money. This group called Mr. Zwitt, CG athletic director and told him they

wanted to pay for the bleachers at the football stadium. There will be \$200,000.00 over 10 years. The board told them that they also needed to support the Fine Arts. This is slow coming in and they are waiting to see how the money will be divided.

- Another concern coming soon is that the football field needs to be replaced and the school is looking to find a donation that will allow that to happen.

Vice-President (Nancy Bonson):

- Dining to Donate will be at Teddy's Burger Joint from 5-9pm on Wednesday, August 17.. They are going to make this a party atmosphere with a corn hole tournament that starts at 6pm. There will also be prizes given out.

Communications (Tracey Woolsey):

- Working on a new server for band website.
- There will be a registry system for all to be members. Those who want to volunteer for different events will be able to go to website and sign up to volunteer by clicking on a box and going to the correct location.

Contest Coordinator (Shalon McCart):

- Calvacade is Saturday, October 8

- Need 1 person to transport judges back to hotel late at night.
- Need committee to make buttons to sell.
